But I don't mind doing it - I like it. I've also been picking stuff for our snacks with Ryan like strawberries cucumbers tomatoes and ground cherries. House Passes Autism Act

The U.S. House of Representatives passed the Autism Collaboration, Accountability, Research, Education and
