

Soil Exploration Activity Guide

Materials Needed:

- 1. Soil Exploration scavenger hunt worksheet (second page)
- 2. Shovel
- 3. Paper plate or tray for collecting and sorting
- 4. Colored pencils, crayons, or pens

Activity Instructions:

- 1. Find a place outside in your backyard or at a park where you can dig without disturbing any established landscaping. You will find a lot of life in rich, moist soil, especially after it has rained! Try a spot near the base of a tree, or around the edging of a lawn or field. Soil critters love to hide in damp, dark places away from sunlight, so be sure to look underneath rocks or other objects.
- 2. Using your shovel, loosen the soil and begin your search! Sort what you find onto a tray or paper plate. If you find any living creatures, remember to handle them with respect!
- 3. Once you have found something on the scavenger hunt, color in the picture with crayons or colored pencils. Can you find them all?
- 4. What did you find the most of? What was the most difficult to find? Why might this be?

Modifications

- If you don't have a shovel, use a stick, an old spoon, or your hands to loosen up the soil.
- If you cannot bend down or sit on the ground, sit at a table and have a helper bring you a couple of shovels of soil on a tray or plate that you can sort through.
- If you can't find any critters, but can find a lot of roots, sticks, or rocks, sort each into categories: small, medium, and large. What did you find the most of? Which category is the biggest?
